



Locating Devices

For Patients with Dementia



<p><u>AngelSense</u> Device attaches to clothing & can only be removed by a care partner. Timeline of locations, routes & transit speeds are accessible from any smartphone. Instant alerts are sent if the person living with dementia is in an unfamiliar place.</p>	<p><u>GPS Smart Sole</u> Device fits into most shoes & provides real-time, detailed report of location history for the person living with dementia. Care partners can set up a safe radius for the person living with dementia. Device connects to any smartphone.</p>	<p><u>iTraq</u> All-in-one location tracking device that contains an additional motion/fall sensor. Alerts are directly sent to a care partner’s smartphone if a fall is detected.</p>	<p><u>MedicAlert Safely Home</u> Bracelet that lists important medical diagnoses (e.g. dementia) The 24/7 Emergency Hotline can be accessed by emergency responders to obtain up to date photo, physical description, health records & emergency contact information.</p>
<p><u>PocketFinder</u> Small tracking device that contains GPS, Cell ID, Google Wi-Fi Touch & an SOS button. Care partners can track a person living with dementia using any smartphone, through a user-friendly app.</p>	<p><u>Project Lifesaver</u> Device is worn around the ankle after the person living with dementia is registered with the Barrie Police Service – Vulnerable People Registry. Care partners can call a local Project Lifesaver agency to locate a missing person living with dementia.</p>	<p><u>Safe Link</u> Small device that is carried by a person living with dementia who wanders. The device sends geographic coordinates to central servers and contains an SOS button. Care partners can view the person living with dementia’s location on the website.</p>	<p><u>Trax</u> Small clip-on device that sends location, speed & direction through cellular networks directly to an app on any smartphone. Care partners can set up “Geofences” to receive alerts if a person living with dementia exits a pre-determined area.</p>
<p><u>Airtag</u> Small, circular tracking device that can be used with Apple’s free “Find My” app. A variety of accessories allow the airtag to be worn as a keychain, wristband, etc.</p>	<p><u>Tile</u> Tracking device that comes in a variety of sizes and shapes.
